The industry demand for skill can be assessed only through a comprehensive Skill Gap Analysis at city level. The Skill Gap Analysis (SGA) should provide a clear picture of the industry wise demand for trained manpower, nature of skills required, trades to be selected for EST&amp;P both for wage employment as well as for self-employment.
